IMPACT STORY: SOMERSET AFRICAN CARIBBEAN NETWORK


Thanks to our grant, more people will learn about our culture and gain a better understanding of the legacy and contribution we've made."

IMPACT STORY: NORTH TAUNTON PARTNERSHIP

North Taunton Partnership is the charity that runs Priorswood Community Centre, supporting some of the most disadvantaged people in the local community. Manager Lesley Council told us how a £2,000 grant from The Somerset Fund supported their work.

"At the centre, we're here for all residents of North Taunton, young and old alike; we're totally inclusive. We have all sorts of social and educational activities: Lunch Club, Tai Chi, Menopause Support, Bereavement Support, Knit and Natter, Digital Support...the list goes on!

Our grant from The Somerset Fund supported our Pride in Priorswood Summer Youth Activities last year. Our summer holidays activities started 15 years ago, when we noticed there were young families that had nothing to do in the summer months. So we brought a few footballs along to the park, and it's just grown organically over the years into what we have now.



Many families are unable to go on family days out or holidays. Our summer activities event is open access and runs for 5 weeks over the summer holidays and we have themed weeks, such as crafts, sports, activities, music and more. It brings the community together and no one has to pay.

Quite often parents and carers tell us it's a lifeline to them. Parents make connections, and the children make friends from different schools. We see lots of new friendships and people building and strengthening their connections in the community.

Grants like the one we received from The Somerset Fund are hugely important and helps to ensure we're able to run this hugely popular summer activities programme every year."

IMPACT STORY: BROMPTON REGIS VILLAGE SHOP

Brompton Regis community shop serves a remote rural village. Chair Christine Cherry told us how a £1,325 grant from The Somerset Fund helped grow what they offer their community.

"Our nearest town is 4 miles away, but there isn't a bus route so we're really a remote part of Exmoor. When the village post office closed our community rallied together to set up the village shop, raising money through grant funding and selling shares. We employ a wonderful shop manager, supported by a team of amazing volunteers.

Many of our community are elderly and no longer drive, so the shop is a lifeline. For some customers when they pop into the shop, we may be the only people they see that day. They rely on us for their everyday needs. We also have a prescription delivery twice a week, and act as a foodbank collection point and parish magazine distributors.



Our grant from The Somerset Fund helped cover the costs of creating a warm and welcoming retail and meeting space, especially during the cold and wet winter months. We've brought our outside tables and chairs inside to offer people a space to meet, have a hot drink and a chat. And we're buying a microwave so we can heat up pasties, soup and other snacks.

A village needs a shop and a pub; they are the heart of a village community. The Somerset Fund grant has helped keep our vital community facility alive."
